Comments

Beam and Roma are steadily working their way through the lower stages of the course. They both show interest in learning but their progress is sometimes affected by inconsistency in class due to learning environments and distractions. To help them benefit fully from lessons, it is important that they attend class with their sound on. If their environment is too noisy, the teacher may mute them, and they can unmute themselves when ready to participate.

Speaking & Listening

Both students are developing their speaking and listening skills. They respond well when focused, but background distractions sometimes reduce their ability to stay engaged.

Reading & Phonics

Beam and Roma are making progress in phonics and early reading. Regular practice will help them gain more confidence and accuracy at this stage.

Grammar & Writing

Their grammar and writing skills are at an early stage, and they are gradually building their foundation. They benefit from clear guidance and short, structured tasks.

Personal Expression & Conversation

Both boys are willing to participate and enjoy expressing themselves when encouraged. More consistent focus will help them develop greater fluency and confidence.

Overall Strengths

Enthusiastic learners when engaged. Steady progress through the lower stages of the course. Willingness to participate and respond to teacher support.

Recommendations for Improvement

Always attend class with sound on to maintain interaction. Minimize distractions in the learning environment. Continue to practice phonics and early reading regularly. Follow teacher guidance to build stronger grammar and writing foundations
