Student Report – Namking and Nfah Year 3

Comments

Nfah and Namking are both excellent Year 3 students who bring enthusiasm, energy, and positivity to every lesson. They are very consistent in attending class and always arrive ready to learn. Both girls are extremely bright and capable, and they regularly achieve very strong results. At times they can become slightly distracted, but when they focus their attention, they produce outstanding work. Their positive attitudes and willingness to participate make them wonderful members of the class. I've noticed that their sentence structure are now more complete and they are reading much more clearly and fluently now. Clear pronunciation will help them a lot to improve their spelling ability moving forward.

Speaking & Listening

Both girls communicate clearly and confidently during class activities. They listen carefully to instructions and to each other, and they are always willing to contribute ideas to discussions. Their participation helps create a lively and supportive learning environment. Nfah and Namking are also able to talk about their daily lives, hobbies, interests, and feelings using simple but clear English, which shows growing confidence in conversation.

Reading & Phonics

Nfah and Namking are strong readers for their age. They read fluently and accurately, with good pronunciation and expression. Their phonics knowledge is solid, allowing them to blend sounds effectively when reading unfamiliar words. They have also demonstrated the ability to read multisyllabic words very well, which is an excellent achievement at this stage. Their comprehension skills are strong, and they engage positively with stories and reading exercises.

Grammar & Writing

Both students show excellent control of grammar for their age. They are able to write clear, well-structured sentences and short texts with good accuracy. Their written work is neat and organised, and they demonstrate creativity when expressing their ideas. Their ability to apply grammar rules effectively quite often is reflected in the higher standard of their written tasks that we have recently been working on.

Personal Expression & Conversation

Nfah and Namking enjoy sharing their ideas and thoughts in class. They are confident when speaking and often bring creativity and imagination to discussions and activities. They are comfortable talking about familiar topics and expressing their feelings and experiences, which shows strong development in their communication skills. They do occasionally lack vocabulary to fully express what they are trying to say. However, they continue to try and show good confidence.

Overall Strengths

Nfah and Namking are bright, hardworking, and enthusiastic students who are progressing very well in all areas of English. Their consistent attendance, positive energy, and strong academic ability help them maintain high standards in class. They remember previously learned topics well and show strong all-round skills at this stage of their learning. They have built a very solid foundation from which to continue developing their English.

Recommendations for Improvement

Both girls should continue following their course on the Universal English Academy website to maintain their strong progress and extend their learning further. Improving concentration and eliminating distractions during lessons will help them make the most of their abilities.
